CITY SCHOOLS BUILDING RENOVATIONS & REPLACEMENTS

VISION

In 2010, City Schools, with community and stakeholders across the city, articulated a bold vision to fully renovate or rebuild all of its school facilities planned for continued use.

In 2011, City Schools released the Jacobs Report, an analysis of all of our school buildings.

It found:

- We had the oldest infrastructure in the state with 97% of our school buildings being built prior to 1985;
 - o 23% prior to 1946
 - o 74% between 1946 and 1985
 - o 3% since 1985, most of them modular and portable

City Schools portfolio of buildings was in very poor condition; 96% of school buildings were in very poor or worst condition indicating the need to be completely replaced or surplused.

Overall utilization was 65%

CITY SCHOOLS BUILDING RENOVATIONS & REPLACEMENTS CONTINUED

21ST CENTURY BUILDING PROGRAM FUNDING

While the goal was and continues to be renovation or rebuilding all of the utilized school buildings; with the initial pot of funds under 21st Century:

- Prioritized communities that have been historically underinvested in and where school closures and the uniting of school communities was necessary, and in severely overly utilized school communities
- Improved utilization to 86%
- In process of renovating/rebuilding 29 buildings for 34 school communities
 - ✓ 26 schools are open

BUILT TO LEARN FUNDING

Built To Learn allows us to renovate 3 more schools:

- ✓ Baltimore City College High School
- ✓ Baltimore Polytechnic High School
- ✓ Western High School

SWING SPACE LOCATION

City College will relocate temporarily to the Thurgood Marshall Building located at 5001 Sinclair Lane, Baltimore, MD 21206.

MOVE IN TIMEFRAME

- School community will move into swing space at the end of the Design phase.
- School must be in swing space before the start of construction for the safety of students and staff.
- Expected Move-In Date: Summer 2024



SWING SPACE PLANNING OVERVIEW

PLANNING

Collaborate with the school, communities, and stakeholders to develop a plan to deliver academic programs currently available at the school and to explore options for transportation services and parking.

MODIFICATIONS TO BUILDING & SITE

Make adjustments to the building and site to support academic programs.

SCHOOL MOVES

Collaborate with school leadership to plan, develop and execute movein and move-out relocation plans.

COMMUNICATIONS

Develop and maintain robust communication with schools, communities, and stakeholders.

PROGRAMMING ACADEMIC SPACES



The planning team will work with school leadership, academic specialists, transportation, food & nutrition, and other District offices to plan swing spaces and services needed to support academic programs. Particular attention will be given to specialized programs.

- Pool
- Black Box Theater
- Chemistry Labs
- Band rooms

ATHLETIC FACILITIES



ATHLETIC FACILITIES ASSESMENT:

On-site play fields are suitable for ALL sports except softball, track & field, tennis. Grounds will review for major defects in play surfaces.

Softball & baseball field creation will need to be reviewed.


Request that blacktop area be reviewed for area located in front of stands for repairs.

No field locker rooms will be available. Similar restrooms at Lake/Reach be considered at the request of Athletic depart.

Gym is not large enough to meet National Federation of State High School Association standards for basketball. With floor prep, volleyball and wrestling may be used.

Gym size will cause Athletic to view scheduling of games for boys and girls' basketball. Two other possible locations.

Locker rooms for PE will have to be addressed.

ATHLETIC FACILITIES PLANNING BY SPORT



FOOTBALL, BASEBALL & SOFTBALL

Funding was put aside to create multi-sport competition fields and can be used for practice. Athletics needs to review placement and field markings as part of the design approval process. Work will include address major defects in play surfaces. i.e. holes, trees, etc.

TENNIS

Suitable for practice.

Another location is needed for competition.

AQUATIC SPORTS

Another location will be identified.

BADMINTON

Gym is suitable for practice and competition.

LACROSSE, SOCCER AND FIELD HOCKEY

Use the multi-sport field. Field use across sports will need to be scheduled.

WRESTLING

Gym is suitable competition.

DANCE

Can take place in the auditorium. Stage needs to be assessed. Holes can be patched.

FIELD LOCKER ROOMS

No field locker rooms.
Portable on-site temporary
field locker rooms may be
possible.

VOLLEYBALL

Gym is suitable for practice. Equipment will need to be assessed for competition.

WEIGHT ROOM

Under review.

TRACK AND FIELD

Another location will be identified.

BASKETBALL

Gym is suitable for practice. Another location may need to be identified for competition.

ATHLETIC TRAINER ROOM

Under review.

TRANSPORTATION & PARKING PLANNING





The planning team, with input from other school leaders, is assessing swing space traffic, transportation and parking needs.



A transportation and parking proposal will be developed for review and approval.



School leadership and staff will have an opportunity to provide feedback on the proposed plan.

SWING SPACE SAFETY



- The City Schools Emergency Manager will conduct a physical security assessment of the swing spaces to determine the conditions of doors, windows, and other safety features.
- Necessary repairs or upgrades will be made to align the security features of the swing space with the features in the current buildings.

The swing space planning team will conduct safety walks to identify conditions (lighting, etc.) along primary walking paths along swing spaces. Where corrections are needed, the team will work with the appropriate agency Department of Transportation, etc. to address them.
