Report to the MOU Executive Committee

City-BCPS Coordinating Committee Meeting on School Construction June 14, 2017

The last Coordinating Committee was held on April 19, 2017 at the Planning Dept.

Attendees: Planning, Mayor's Office, BCRP, MSA, BCPS, Housing, MOIT, DOT, ABAG, PSCP

1. Review and Approve Minutes of January 18, 2017

2. Follow-up items from January 18

- Schedule meeting with Councilman Henry re: Walter P. Carter once feasibility is complete. Schedule tour of Fort Worthington when it's further along (around end of April).
- Feasibility meeting was 4/10 challenging site issues.
- o Will set up meeting with Councilman Henry.
- Laurie will send Mignon and Eric Planning Commission dates; schedule presentation.
- o Scheduled for June 15, Noon. Will provide a general program and budget update, along with a few school highlights. DOP will let them know if there are new Commissioners.
- Monthly tours of Frederick and Ft. Worthington
- o Mignon will schedule a tour for Tracey/BCRP.
- Resolve Fairmount Harford property line issues with BCRP.
- o BCRP should be included in the 21st Century design-build presentations, and provide advice.
- o Build into the timeline time for subdivision process start early.
- Mignon will send out objectives/narratives for the Love Your Schools Campaign.
- o Mignon will schedule meeting with City executives re: a stepped-up communication campaign (generally, not specifically on Love Your Schools).
- Nicole to send DOP status of Year 1 cooperative use agreements, when there's something to report.

3. Status Reports

a. Feasibility & Design Status – BCPS/MSA • General:

 \circ Opening celebrations: Large 21st Century celebration (Fort Worthington) around August 23. Details to come. Smaller, customized celebrations at other schools.

Outstanding Design Issues

Frederick:

a. DPW has given initial OK to remove the asphalt on Lehman. Meeting with them next week to discuss details/possibility.

b. City Schools will be installing the fence around the school June 1 – need a decision about a gate for entry from a student path before then. DOP get a schedule on Lehman improvements and walking path. City Schools will find out if there's a policy on fences around schools and gates in fences.

Harford Heights/Sharp Leadenhall:

- a. Mignon to schedule follow-up design meeting to discuss options for front lot and March building
- b. March building: If it is surplussed to City it must be on a separate lot

Walter P. Carter:

a. Challenging site issues. Not sure how to meet program requirements and keep the pool

o Cherry Hill:

- a. City Schools project includes demolishing Patapsco as part of their stormwater management likely to occur in second half of 2018
- b. BCRP trying to get funding to construct the Recreation Center sooner than later, and incorporate a sports field
- c. Interim rec space in the neighborhood is a problem, and currently there's not a location for summer camp, unless approved by Carter G. Woodson. BCRP will follow-up with Chris Harried in Mayor's Office. Other follow-up: faith-based community (Tracey Estepp has meeting scheduled); Sagamore group (Lisa Hodges)
- o School rendering signage: City Schools has completed a template for construction managers to use. Hope to see on sites by June 1.
- o Love Your School Campaign will roll out later in the year, with more comprehensive 21₅t Century communications.

b. Swing Space Additions/Changes - BCPS

8-9 school swings in 2018.

c. Status of Cooperative Use Spaces for Phase 1 Schools - BCPS

- General amendment request is being considered by BCRP, prior to going into the cooperative agreements.
- Fort Worthington: May 1 meeting re: programming to resolve City Schools/BCRP differences
- Meet to discuss big picture.

d. Status of Fiber Connection Plan for 21st Century Schools – BCPS

Goal is to get 10 GB access to all schools. Consultant report is complete. Evaluating three alternatives – expect analysis at end of May. Will decide on a new contract or renegotiate with incumbent.

4. Planning and Design Coordination – DOP/BCPS/BCRP

Walter P. Carter, Frederick, and Harford Heights/Sharp Leadenhall – all have design issues to coordinate around.

5. Various Updates:

a. Surplus School Buildings and Disposition Process

- DOP convened a Surplus Schools Task Force. Looking at site assessments, outreach, a response to legislation; have had tours with the Mayor's Office.
- Next steps: work with Mayor's Office on outreach. Northwestern is the likely first effort.
- There may be demolition funding from the State.
- August 1 deadline for response to the legislation regarding a plan for surplus schools.

b. Maryland Historic Trust Updates

Nothing new.

c. INSPIRE Update and Agency Follow-up

- 2 more plans have been adopted by PC: Arundel + Cherry Hill; Lyndhurst
- Plans completing this year: Robert Poole, Pimlico, Forest Park + Calvin Rodwell; Patterson
- Potential new launches this year: Fairmount Harford, John Rurah, Govans, Walter P. Carter, Bay Brook
- Sidewalk repair, tree pits, and tree planting: Work began last week along primary walking routes for Fort Worthington and Frederick. Trees will be in before end of May; sidewalk work to follow
- State Safe Routes to School grant opportunity: We're working with DOT to submit an application for infrastructure improvements around Pimlico.

d. ABAG SCNI Update

- Convened a Developer Tour around Pimlico developers interested in opportunities around school. Next up: Reservoir Hill (John Eager Howard) and Shipley Hill (Frederick)
- May 1: convening a tour with a finance institution to consider grocery store sites
- Lisa is happy to help with messaging to generate community interest could pilot something in Pimlico (think about starting with having renderings at CC Jackson)
- Working with communities on a youth summit

GENERAL UPDATES

IAC Designees and PSCP staff attended a BCPS/MSA-hosted tour of 21st Century School sites on MAY 17. The tour included an in-depth tour of the Lyndhurst EM site, which is a Year One project now under construction and expected to open in JAN 2018; and a brief tour of the Walter P. Carter PK-8 site, which is a Year Two school in the planning phase.

MOU-SPECIFIC UPDATES

MOU §1 – ROLES, RIGHTS, AND RESPONSIBILITIES

The First Amendment to the Memorandum of Understanding for the Construction and Revitalization of Baltimore City Public Schools was approved at the IAC meeting on MAY 2, 2017.

MOU §2 - EDUCATIONAL SPECIFICATIONS, FEASIBILITY STUDIES, AND DESIGN ELEMENTS No actions to report.

MOU §4 - IAC AND BPW PROCESSES

Enhanced Approval Packages (EAP) for Bay Brook EM (#124) and Calvin M. Rodwell EM (#256) were approved at the IAC meeting on MAY 2, 2017.

MOU §10 - SCHOOL CLOSURES

No actions to report.

MOU §11 - COMPREHENSIVE AND BUILDING MAINTENANCE PLANS

COMPREHENSIVE MAINTENANCE PLAN (CMP): IAC continues to be concerned with whether the current BCPS operational budget will support continued implementation of the CMP, first approved in 2014 and last updated in 2016.

- (c) (1) The eligibility and benefits rules in place on January 1, 2017, for the Medical Assistance Program may be altered if the changes are:
- (i) required under federal law to qualify for the receipt of federal funds;
 - (ii) included in legislation passed by the General Assembly;
- (iii) proposed in the annual State budget submitted to the General Assembly; or
- (iv) <u>subject to paragraph (2) of this subsection, submitted in writing</u> to the Maryland Medicaid Advisory Committee.
- (2) If a change in the eligibility and benefits rules is submitted to the Maryland Medicaid Advisory Committee under paragraph (1)(iv) of this subsection, a legislative member of the committee may refer the change to the Legislative Policy Committee for a 60-day review and comment period.
- (d) In developing any changes or redesign to the Medical Assistance Program or the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program, the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene and the Department of Human Resources shall establish a group of interested stakeholders to collaborate on any changes or program redesign.

SECTION 18. 16. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, notwithstanding:

- (a) <u>Notwithstanding</u> § 10–645(h)(1) of the Economic Development Article and any other provision of law, for fiscal year 2018 only:
- (1) \$4,600,000 from the General State School Fund may not be withheld from the Baltimore City Board of School Commissioners by the State Comptroller and deposited in the Baltimore City Public School Construction Financing Fund established under § 10–656 of the Economic Development Article; and
- (2) the Maryland Stadium Authority shall credit \$4,600,000 of the fund balance of the Baltimore City Public School Construction Facilities Fund established under § 10–657 of the Economic Development Article that represents money held in reserve for Baltimore City in accordance with Section § 10–645(i) of the Economic Development Article to the Baltimore City Public School Construction Financing Fund to satisfy a portion of the payment required by § 10–645(h)(1) of the Economic Development Article.
 - (b) It is the intent of the General Assembly that the actions taken in accordance

with subsection (a) of this section may not be taken in any fiscal year after fiscal year 2018.

SECTION 19. 17. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, on or before November 1, 2017, November 1, 2018, and and quarterly until November 1, 2019, Baltimore City Public Schools shall submit a report to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State Government Article, the Senate Budget and Taxation Committee and the House Appropriations Committee on the status of the school system's structural budget deficit and the actions that have been taken to reduce the gap between ongoing revenues and expenditures, including:

- (1) the size and components of the structural deficit in the current year and projected for the next year;
- (2) the actions that have been taken to reduce the structural deficit accompanied by the ongoing impact of the action on revenues or expenditures;
- (3) the joint procurement of goods or services, or shared services, with the City of Baltimore or other jurisdictions that have promoted efficiency and reduced costs;
- (4) the alignment of employee personnel contributions and benefits with the City of Baltimore;
- (5) savings from the strategic implementation of the Career Pathways and Achievement Units Compensation System;
- (6) consolidation or right-sizing of underutilized school facilities, in addition to the requirements of Chapter 647 of the Acts of 2013;
- (7) administrative and operational efficiencies at the central office and school levels; and
- (8) <u>initiatives and efforts to retain students and attract new students to the school system.</u>

SECTION 18. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:

- (a) The State Secretary of Transportation, in coordination with the Montgomery County and Prince George's County Departments of Transportation, shall engage the Secretary's counterparts in Virginia and Washington, D.C., and the appropriate officials in the federal government for the purpose of revising the Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority Compact of 1966 and implementing other reforms necessary to ensure the near-term and long-term viability of the Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority (WMATA). In doing so, the Secretary shall develop, propose, and seek agreement on reforms related to the following:
 - (1) the legal and organizational structure of WMATA;

Design and Construction

• Contracts:

- Arlington is the only project with design and pre-construction contracts still held by Baltimore City Public Schools (City Schools). Transfer to Maryland Stadium Authority (MSA) will occur upon final approval of the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) amendment for MSA to hold all contracts by the State Board of Public Works.
- o Furniture Contract: The design, finish selections, fabrication, delivery and installation schedule for vendors Duron, Inc. and School Specialties under awarded blanket contracts has been successful thus far and all activities are on schedule. Fort Worthington and Fredrick will deliver in mid-July and late June, respectively. The 21st Century interior designer has completed furniture layouts and for Lyndhurst and John Eager Howard selections using the program-developed standards catalogue including significant interface with the schools and the 21st Century Academic Specialist.
- City Schools' design, technology and facilities operations officials continue be key to the progress
 and delivery of each school project. They provide input, comment, guidance and approval in
 compliance with design standards and/or other City Schools requirements to meet educational
 facilities function and performance. Among the activities in which City Schools is involved are
 submittal reviews and approvals, architectural design and quality reviews and inspections,
 construction administration, construction meetings, requests for information, value engineering
 and change order approvals.
- City Schools is working diligently with the MSA to ensure that all work, training, commissioning, contract and operational turnover and closeout actions and activities for the first two schools (Fort Worthington and Fredrick) in August are coordinated to support the opening of schools on time. They will serve as the model and baseline for an extremely aggressive second two schools (John eager Howard and Lyndhurst) that will deliver in the fall and be prepared to accept returning students and open after the winter 2017/18 break. City Schools will facilitate operational compliance and ensure that all partner City agencies are engaged and City Schools can open and operate as the program enters these first phases of completion.

Plan Year 2 Schools

• Plan Year 2 Feasibility Studies were initiated later than originally scheduled (2016 versus 2015). Therefore, they became subject to impact by new information on changing enrollment projections. Also, additional information regarding school sites introduced revised assumptions that had to be incorporated into delivery expectations for the Year 2 portfolio. In a few cases the grade configuration and educational specifications were revisited. Accordingly, the Year 2 Schools have been adjusted in terms of priority which in several cases required significant shifts community engagement and feasibility study completion. Impacts to the overall schedule should be evident by the end of the calendar year, 2017. Therefore, official opening dates currently listed for the Year 2 schools is subject to change.

Community and Public Relations

Community and Public Relations: City Schools has logged over 70 direct outreach dates in 2017.
Each outreach effort also routinely includes several aspects including structured stakeholder
and school partner activities, core teams and community group meetings who are involved in
design input, student focus groups, scripts, flyers and phone calls, separate or additional parent
and staff meetings and political communications and updates.

Communications publically posted the first of four public service advertisements (PSA)s for the 21st Century Program, and continues to make timely updates of the program website including regular CM job postings through MOED. The 21st Century program is also now supporting social media- Facebook, Twitter, and Instagram - as part of the communications program.

- Transition management teams are being developed to ensure success required to coordinate
 with schools that are combining from closing schools Negotiations with City agencies and school
 partners continue. Partner agreements including operating and licensing activities and
 cooperative or designated space for each school have been challenging and are still in the process
 of being finalized.
- Background Investigation Processing: City Schools' Human Capital Pre-Enrollment Office has
 processed almost 2300 applications for approval to work on the 21st Century projects. This
 includes design, construction and subcontractor teams. In addition to MSA workforce and local
 hiring reports, City Schools provides report monthly updates to the Collaboration Working Group
 lead by the Mayor's Office on Workforce Development (MOED).

Technology

City Schools continues to play a key role in managing the work to procure and coordinate IT/AV
connectivity, network, instructional technology implementation and electronic security
installation for schools.

Computerized Maintenance Management System (CMMS)

The 2013 Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) requires a new CMMS technology to enhance facilities management at City Schools. In October 2016, Operations rolled out its new CMMS, SchoolDude, which is a fully integrated enterprise solution that utilizes automated work flows to streamline the maintenance and operations of our educational facilities. This includes the management of corrective and preventative maintenance work request, utility consumption and cost and the ability to predict future projects, prioritize current ones and forecast and easily budget facility needs.
