Report to the MOU Executive Committee

City-BCPS Coordinating Committee Meeting on School Construction March 23, 2016

The last Coordinating Committee was held on <u>January 20, 2016</u> at the Planning Dept.

Attendees: Planning, Mayor's Office, BCRP, MSA, BCPS, Housing, MOIT, DOT, DPW

1. Committee members amended and approved the minutes of October 21, 2015.

2. Status Reports

a. Feasibility & Design Status—BCPS/MSA

- Reports were provided on all Year 1 & Year 2 Schools
- Maryland Historical Trust reviews: Any schools needing review have been submitted; comments expected soon. Interest in Lyndhurst, MSA will share comments when they are received.

Cross Country and Zoning: There was a brief discussion about when in the process a thorough zoning review occurs/whose responsibility it is, in order to avoid future situations similar to Cross Country. In the future, BCPS is requesting architects to pay particular attention to zoning, traffic, and other areas that may bring up issues. Consider putting these elements in the feasibility Scope of Work. 20/20 hindsight – it's helpful to know of zoning or other restrictions/requirements when selecting schools. BCPS is having many discussions with stakeholders in the Cross Country area to decide the direction to go. They are looking at how long it will take to get a zoning variance, if that is the desired direction. They will also be requesting a traffic analysis. BCPS will keep Planning apprised.

Canton: Southeast Community Development Association has concerns about overcrowding and would like research conducted. BCPS agreed that feasibility studies of Canton and Lombard still need to be done to determine the impact of enrollment in southeast. Possibly engage with Housing and Community Development to understand the impact of the Perkins Homes redevelopment. Confirmed by BCPS that Canton will be taken off the 21st Century Schools map, and Commodore Rogers and Highlandtown #237 will be added.

b. Status of Fiber Connection Plan for 21st Century Schools—MOIT/BC^{PS}
Mignon Anthony (BCPS), Joe Carella (MOIT), and Michael Rading (BCPS) presented.

December 2015 target date for pilot City fiber project at Edmondson HS and Curtis Bay ES/MS was not met. MOIT's goal is to have the e-rate plan in place by July 2016, for next year's application. BCPS invited the Mayor's Office to join them for the next planning meeting.

c. Status of Cooperative Use Spaces for Phase 1 Schools—BCPS

MOU has been shown to Comptroller and City Council President, and will next go to the Mayor and then Board of Estimates.

3. Various Updates

a. INSPIRE Update

 Planning hired two new staff: Jennifer Leonard (INSPIRE Program Manager) and Mary Colleen Buettner (INSPIRE Planner)

- Developed a list matching planners to schools will share
- Have met with agencies to share recommendations for first four schools
- Completing recommendation reports and timeline for delivering plans to Planning Commission
- Planning is working with the <u>National Resource Network</u> (NRN) to look at three school/anchor institution areas (Park Heights/Sinai, Frederick/Bon Secours, Cherry Hill/ Harbor Hospital) as well as analyzing options for surplus schools. NRN is looking at recommendations for school site reuse generally, but also more detailed case studies for Westside, Garrison, and Briscoe.
- ABAG has posted a position for someone to work with INSPIRE in the same three areas
- INSPIRE will start at Patterson when the EAP is approved.

b. Surplus School buildings and disposition process

- BCPS has developed the required documentation to send to the State for Dr. Raynor Brown, Pinderhughes, Langston-Hughes and Independence; State will provide letter to BCPS approving and confirming their surplus status.
- Paul Turner will reach out to the City's Space Utilization Committee, which will
 determine what City agency will be responsible for each facility; keys will be turned
 over at that point
- There is a 60-90-day window for appeals that must be addressed.

c. City update on Cherry Hill Rec Center Project Status

- Rec and Parks was approved for state funding
- Currently in stormwater review
- Construction starting fall 2016 18-24 month construction duration
- DPW mentioned that the water meter at the old school will need to be moved for construction

d. Additional Demolition funds

- Housing is managing the process for the CORE funding, recently announced by Governor
- Peggy Webster noted that there is an existing pipeline of priority locations that will be the first projects funded but that there will be a new/similar process involving community consultation, historic preservation, etc.
- INSPIRE is one of the ways in which demo priorities will be screened
- BCPS can be involved in the conversations, when they occur
- Tom mentioned that Planning is hiring a consultant to develop a Green Network Plan, to look beyond the existing pipeline and address neighborhoods with the least amount of green and most environmental challenges; work is expected to begin in February

4. Other Issues/Announcements

BCPS is working with community members around Fort Worthington to address concerns, including parking for construction workers, speed of construction trucks, and routes the trucks take. They are helping the construction managers develop regular meetings with the community.

BCPS is planning for a program groundbreaking.

Report to the Executive Committee Collaborative Group March 23, 2016

Supplier Diversity Sub Group

Since the last sub-group committee meeting in December, the Mayor's Office of Minority and Women's Business Development (MWBD) has worked closely with Maryland Stadium Authority (MSA) and BCPS to assist with outreach and publicizing bid opportunities specifically by:

- 1. MWBD sent targeted electronic email blasts (aka. eblasts) to minority and women owned businesses in the months of January, February, and March.
- 2. MWBD participated in a minority and women owned business event held by J. Vinton Shaefer of Cain Contracting CM team on February 25th.
- 3. MWBD continues to work with BCPS to host the upcoming outreach campaign to be held in April 2016.

Additionally, MWBD has been working closely with MSA to identify projects that can be unbundled and advertised as small business reserve (SBR) bid opportunities. By doing this, the bids advertised as SBR allows for more participation by smaller firms in the city and the region to get an opportunity to become primary contractors, thus expanding the potential pool of future bids. Currently MSA is reviewing upcoming projects to determine which projects have the best potential to meet the criteria for the SBR program. Meetings are held quarterly, typically following the larger Executive Committee meetings, and the next sub-group meeting is scheduled for the last week in April.

Local Hiring Sub Group

At the last meeting in January, MOED reported out about the 3 job positions that had already been filled by MOED clients, and is eager to engage with the operations at Fort Worthington School. Based on the most recent interactions with MSA, the Fort Worthington project has identified 10 discrete contractors to cover projects ranging from demolition to landscaping to electrical, which will result in a need for 24 local new hires. The next sub-group meeting is scheduled for April 7th.

GENERAL

- On February 18, 2016, the Baltimore City Public Schools Annual Report was approved by the IAC
- The position of Executive Director of Facilities for City Schools has been filled in order to coordinate all facility management issues. The IAC has placed the highest importance on this position.

MOU §2.A EDUCATIONAL SPECIFICATIONS, FEASIBILITY STUDIES, AND DESIGN ELEMENTS

 Since last reported on January 20, 2016, no educational specifications, feasibility studies or schematic designs have been submitted for IAC staff review. Staff is available to review the Year 2 feasibility studies that are in progress.

MOU §4.C IAC AND BPW PROCESS – 10-Year Plan Project Submissions

- Summary of IAC actions to date:
 - o Of 11 Year 1 schools, Enhanced Approval Packages (EAP) for 10 schools have been approved by the IAC.
 - o The EAP and schematic design for the Patterson High School/Claremont Education School has not been submitted to the IAC staff for review.
 - o Since January 20, 2016, DDs for Arundel PK-2 were reviewed by the IAC staff.

MOU §11 COMPREHENSIVE AND BUILDING MAINTENANCE PLANS

- Comprehensive Maintenance Plan (CMP) and Maintenance Performance Metrics:
 - Implementation of the CMP. IAC continues to have concerns about whether the City Schools budget will support the staffing changes that were outlined in the September 2014 approved CMP. Particular attention will be focused on preventive maintenance. We continue to stress that this will become a critical issue with the handover of the first 21st Century school facilities in 2018.
 - The Building Maintenance Plan (BMP): PSCP staff will continue to review the BMPs for Fort Worthington ES and Frederick ES Schools as new information is provided. BMPs for other 21st Century projects will follow the same procedure.
 - Completion of Maintenance Performance Metrics: The delay in procurement of the CMMS
 has caused a delay in the school system's ability to develop and report on the
 approved Maintenance Performance Metrics.
 - o Meetings to discuss maintenance issues are held weekly with the director of facility operations and maintenance.

Project Planning and Delivery:

- City Schools will continue to populate the PSCP-developed Project Progress Review report to allow monitoring and reporting on improvements in the delivery of approved CIP projects. Improvement in this arena will eventually have significance for the life-cycle renewal of the 21st Century schools.
- Under the new Executive Director of Facilities, capital budget and project delivery procedures are being developed and evaluated for improvement.
- o Meetings to discuss capital improvement projects are held on a bi-weekly schedule.

School tours:

 IAC staff continues to make site visits to schools at a rate of about four to six per week, now focusing on HVAC projects approved in the FY 2017 CIP and HVAC projects currently under construction.

MOU §10 and §12 SCHOOL CLOSURES / UTILIZATION PLAN & TARGETS

- On March 10, 2016, the IAC approved the property transfer and facility status change for:
 - Or. Rayner Browne Elementary/Middle School #025. The facility is listed in Exhibit 6 of the MOU. The school system will retain the 9,500 square foot portable building on the site for educational purposes. The Baltimore City government has not determined the future use of the property.
 - o Independence Charter Modular Building #333. The facility was previously listed in Exhibit 6 of the MOU for closure in 2018; however, the closure was expedited because of the anticipated renovation/addition project at the Robert Poole Building #56. The city government plans to demolish the modular building.

Board of Public Works approvals of these actions are scheduled for April 6, 2016.

Baltimore City Public Schools – December 2015

Attached is the Statement of Revenues and Expenditures related to the activities for the Baltimore City Public Schools.

Revenues

Revenues for the period ending December 31, 2015 were \$18.9 million. This consist of \$10.0 million from lottery for fiscal year 2016, \$4.0 million from Baltimore City for the bottle tax, facility rental fee and table games revenues,\$4.3 million from additional revenues collected in fiscal year 2015 in excess of the \$8.0 million paid by Baltimore City and investment income of \$600,000.

Expenditures

Overall, expenses through December 2015 are under budget by \$17.3 million. Below are some of the major variances:

Salaries, Wages and Benefits

This category is over budget for the period ending December 2015 by \$9,000. The primaries reasons are the budget allocations for attorneys and accounting is less than the amount budgeted but there were three pays in the month of December 2015 and only two were budgeted. In addition, in October 2015, there were no health insurance deductions for the one pay period.

Telephone

This category is under budget for the period ending December 31, 2015 by \$1,000. The primary reason relates to the conference call budget. The budget for conference calls as of December 31, 2015 is \$1,250 and only \$15 was used. Also missing one month of cellphone use for August 2015 for approximately \$500.

Travel

This category is under budget for the period ending December 31, 2015 by \$600. The budget included more trips to Annapolis and to the job sites.

Contractual Services

This category is under budget for the period ending December 31, 2015 by \$17.2 million. The budget was created with \$3.7 million being spent monthly on architects, pre-construction, testing and inspections, program manager, reimbursement to Baltimore City Public Schools year two feasibility studies and phasing. To date, this category is only averaging \$1.0 million of spending.

Office Supplies and Equipment

These categories were over budget for the period ending December 31, 2015 by \$5,000. This period included the purchase of furniture that was budgeted for later in the year.

Fixed Charges

This category is under budget for the period ending December 31, 2015 by \$6,300. The budget was based on the offices being expanded by 900 s.f. in July 2015 but did not happen until December 2015.

Current Status:

- Fort Worthington site preparation and existing building demolition continues.GMP package # 2 was approved today, March 23, 2016 representing the remaining trade packages for construction of the project.
- Frederick site preparations and interior/partial building demolition continues. Remaining GMP packages have been bid and are currently under review. Anticipated approvals for the remaining GMP packages are April 4th and April 6th for MSA and BPW respectively. Completion for both schools remain scheduled Summer 2017.
- John Eager Howard currently in Construction Document (CD) phase, bid set submissions scheduled for end of March, with Anticipated GMP approval in June 2016. Construction currently scheduled to begin July 2016, completion scheduled for December 2017.

- Patterson feasibility study approved by BCS Board, currently in procurement process for A/E and CM preconstruction.

- Owner Controlled Insurance Program (OCIP) risk consultant under review, anticipated selection May 2016.

City Schools Update

Plan Year 1 Schools

Enhanced Approval Packages (EAP)

Patterson-Claremont's EAP was approved by the School Board of Commissioners on January 26, 2016, by the IAC and via email vote of the Executive Committee on February The project is in design and CMR procurement as noted by MSA.

Design Status

- The City Schools managed projects, Cherry Hill, Forest Park, Arlington and Pimlico are currently proceeding with design as noted:
 - Cherry Hill 100% Design Development was submitted this month and is currently under review. Cherry Hill is on schedule to open in August 2018.
 - Forest Park is at the 100% Design Development review stage and also scheduled to be completed for opening in August of 2018.
 - Pimlico 100% Design Development submission was made on 3/1/16 and is pending final approval. The architect is proceeding at their own risk into the Construction Document phase. Pimlico is scheduled for completion in August 2018.
 - Arlington this project has moved from approved Schematic Design into Design Development. Arlington and Pimlico will share the same swing location and are both scheduled for phased occupancies. Arlington is also scheduled for completion in August 2018.

Plan Year 2 Schools

Feasibility Studies

- Plan Year 2 Feasibility Studies- General
 - o RFP's for Feasibility Studies have been issued in four groups ('lots') to the prequalified Year 1 design architects
 - Fairmont Hartford has been added as an addition to the Year 2 portfolio with anticipated completion in 2019
- Current Status

- Fairmont-Harford building is nearing completion and should be available for staff review in April. Following the inclusion of staff comments, the EAP will be developed.
- Lot 1 schools consists of John Rurah, Calvin Rodwell, Cross Country and Medfield Heights. The studies for John Rurah, Calvin Rodwell and Medfield Heights are 95% complete. It is anticipated that these studies and the associated EAP's will be complete in April, 2016.
 - The feasibility study for Cross Country Elementary will advance after traffic study evaluations are concluded to assist in addressing zoning concerns about the project. Next steps will be determined at that time.
- O Lot 2 schools consists of Govans, Walter P Carter, Bay Brook and Calverton. Awarded architects selected and under contract include Govans ES Crabtree Rohrbaugh & Associates, Walter P. Carter ES/MS- Penza Bailey Architects/Newman Architects, Bay Brook ES/MS- JRS Architects and Calverton ES/MS- JRS Architects. The selected A/E firms are all currently under contract and the studies and associated community meetings are all scheduled or underway.
- O Lot 3 schools consists of Harford Heights, Montebello and Mary E. Rodman. Pursuant to the annual portfolio review approved by the BOSC in December, the study for the Canton Building was removed from this group and will be replaced with studies for additions at Commodore John Rodgers and Highlandtown 237. This action helps to address overcrowding of PK-5 and PK-8 facilities in the southeast area.

Requests for Proposals were issued for the first three schools on January 8th and responses were received in February. Architect selection is complete and awaiting School Board and MSA approval.

The RFP's for Group 4 will be issued in the next three months. It is anticipated that the replacement schools in Lot 3 will be addressed during this timeframe, as well.

School Closures/Utilization Plan & Targets

- Current Status
 - On December 12, 2015, Dr. Thornton sent a formal letter to the MOU partners related to the recommendation to the Board of School Commissioners to revise the Utilization Resolution and include district wide utilization targets with swing space.
 - The Board of School Commissioners approved the Utilization Resolution on January 12th to include district wide targets for swing space. The revised language is below:

"The Board also establishes a final target district wide utilization rate with swing space

of 80% for the School year 2019-2020 and an intermediate target district wide utilization with swing space rate of 75% for the School year 2015-2016."

Computerized Maintenance Management System (CMMS)

The 2013 Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) requires new CMMS technology to enhance facilities management at City Schools. The system will utilize automated work flows to streamline all aspects of repair and maintenance work orders, preventative maintenance, asset management, and inventory management.

Current Status

- The June 3, 2015 update reported City Schools Department of Facilities Maintenance and Operations would request that the Board of School Commissioners (BOSe) approve a contract for a CMMS vendor procured via a competitive RFP process. In accordance with State MBE Regulations, the vendor was notified on May 7, 2015 they were the apparent low bidder and were required to submit MBE Forms C&D. Upon receipt of the required MBE Forms, City Schools' MBE office determined the vendor was not compliant with the intent of the regulations. In consultation with City Schools' Legal Counsel and MBE office, City Schools issued a Second Best and Final Offer. The vendor submitted a lower cost proposal and complied with MBE goals
- o In July 2015 City Schools' shared the results with the MSA which prompted subsequent conversations with the vendor, during which it became apparent they had diminished the scope of services from their original proposal and that the proposal would not be acceptable.
- As a result of the above, City Schools' Chief Operating Officer and other City Schools staff entered discussions regarding additional options, both internally and with the MSA, to complete procurement of the CMMS.
- O It was decided that in accordance with 10-201 of City Schools Administrative Regulations, City Schools would piggyback the competitively solicited contract No. 12 (Work Order & Asset Management) issued by the Association of Educational Purchasing Association (AEPA) to complete the CMMS procurement. The procurement was approved by the BOSC on January 12th.

- City Schools staff is currently finalizing the procurement data and MOU to be sent to the MSA for final review and approval by the MSA Board.
- Total implementation of the CMMS and maintenance and support services software will occur over a five year period following.
