APPROVALS

Michael Frenz called the meeting to order at 3:07 pm and asked for a motion to approve the open minutes from the June 4, 2014 meeting.

Status Reports

IAC Report

David Lever discussed the Comprehensive Maintenance Package (CMP) that was approved by the IAC and that it meets the requirements identified in the MOU. Dr. Lever also discussed the status of the annual maintenance inspections of City Schools and that 6 schools have been completed. The IAC approved the closure of Paquin and CORPS Building which will go to BPW on October 1, 2014. Other information was provided in a handout attached hereto.

Financial

David Raith gave a summary of the MSA financial budget attached hereto. He also noted that there will be an RFP for underwriting services expected to be selected by early 2015 for the program. The MSA Board will act on a Reimbursement Resolution to allow bond proceeds to be used retroactively for design services.

MSA/City Schools Report

Gary McGuigan gave an update on the MSA report which is attached hereto. The report estimates that 23-28 schools can be supported through the program, a lower number than previously estimated. The reasons for lowering the number of expected total schools are detailed in the October legislative report, located on the MSA website. Mr. McGuigan noted that the program is still in a very early phase and that these conservative projections are based on the latest information available from the Year 1 feasibility studies and assumptions on bond rates which currently project a \$980 million program. The Year 1 schools will begin the design phase in September 2014 and procurement of the Year 2 feasibility studies will begin by the end of this year. Larry Flynn gave an update on Baltimore City Schools attached hereto.

Mr. Stosur started by stating that this evening, September 30, 2014 will be the first workshop to discuss the INSPIRE initiative at John Edgar Howard.
