- Chair Ruley noted that the purpose of the meeting was to discuss the potential litigation that will result from recent construction issues at Baltimore City Schools.
- The meeting minutes from the previous meeting were approved by motion made by Dr. Santelises and seconded by Mr. Thompson. All members voted favorably, and the meeting minutes were adopted.

CLOSED MEETING RECAP

- As required by Open Meetings Act Section 3-306, these meeting minutes contain the following information about the closed portion of the prior meeting:
