A. PROJECT SUMMARY

A. PROJECT SUMMARY

A.1 Project Justification:

John Ruhrah PK-8 #228 currently has a poor Facility Conditions Index (FCI) and Educational Adequacy Score (EAS) based on the previously completed 2010 Jacobs building assessment report: School #228 has a FCI of 76.4 and a EAS of 54.5. The expansion of Ruhrah would help to alleviate current over-utilization, which will in turn impact larger issues of over-crowding in the Southeast. The project will start construction December 2017 and is planned to be complete by the fall of 2019. In SY 2019-20, it is anticipated that the State Rated Capacity of the building will be 976 and its projected utilization rate will be 93%.

A.2 Project Description:

The John Ruhrah building is currently totaled at 62,638 square feet; there is additional square footage from two modulars and a portable on site for an additional area of 14,260 sf. The original John Ruhrah Building was built in 1930, with an addition in 1976, modulars added in 1995 and 1999, and a portable added in 2008. The new gross square footage to meet the program requirements will be approximately 135,317 square feet. Ruhrah's projected enrollment will be 911 by SY2019-20. For the development of the site specific educational specification the PK - 8 prototype for an elementary-middle school (4-section) was used for the standard.



B. PROJECT BACKGROUND

B.1 Community Description and History:

John Ruhrah Elementary/Middle School is located in the Greektown community, which is located in the Southeast geographic area of Baltimore City. The school zone is composed of several other communities including Hopkins Bayview and Bayview, as well as the Canton Industrial Area and the Pulaski Indisutrial Area. Major boundaries in the area are comprised of rail lines to the west, and I-95 and rail lines to the south; Eastern Avenue bisects the school zone into two areas.

John Ruhrah Elementary/Middle #228 is located in Community Statistical Area (CSA) #41 (Orangeville/E. Highlandtown), which consists of a mix of primarily office-residence/business/industrial/residential zoning: M-2, M-3; R-6, R-7, R-8; B-2, B-3; and O-R. The past several years have shown major growth as shown by development (approximately 380 dwelling units are under construction/complete), and population growth, particularly within the Hispanic community which showed an increase of 26.6% between 2000 and 2010. The school serves one of the largest bilingual populations in Baltimore City Public Schools, with students representing 14 different countries speaking 10 different languages. In this CSA, 21.1% of the population is under the age of 18, and population showed an increase of 5.1% between the 2000 and 2010 Census. The majority of the housing stock is defined as Middle Market (these have median sales values above the City's average, as well as high homeownership rates). The median housing price rose 27.8% between 2010 and 2013.

B.2 School Description and History:

Constructed in 1930, John Ruhrah Elementary/Middle is a Pre-K through 8th grade school located in southeast Baltimore. The school was originally an elementary school, and started transitioning to an elementary/middle school in SY2007-SY2008 by introducing a 6th grade. The original building (44,587 sf)was added on to and renovated in 1976 (18,051 sf); two 2-classroom modulars were added in 1995, and one 4-classroom modular was added in 1999; and an 8-classroom portable was added in 2008 (the portable does not count towards the capacity of the Ruhrah facility). The middle school is currently housed in the modulars/portable. A new media center/technology center was done in 2011.

The school is approximately 76,898 sf (62,638 sf with an additional 14,260 sf from the modulars and portable) on a 5 acre full block site at 701 Rappolla Street. The school currently has 795 students enrolled for the 2015-2016 school year, up from 788 in 2014-2015. The student to teacher ratio for SY2014-SY2015 was 15:1. The SY2014-SY2015 make up of the student body was: 72% Hispanic; 19% white; 6% African American; and 3% other.

The past several years have shown consistent growth in enrollment, resulting in an SY2015-2016 utilization of 190%; this, coupled with larger over-crowding issues within the southeast has prompted City Schools to look at John Ruhrah Elementary/Middle as part of the 21st Century Plan.



B.4 Summary of Recent Feasibility Studies or Assessments:

The 10-Year Plan's recommendation, based on the Jacob's building assessment report (2010), for John Ruhrah is for the school program to be expanded and that both a renovation or replacement be considered for the school. The rationale behind this recommendation is as follows:

- The FCI suggests that renovation or replacement should both be considered, and that a building replacement may be the more cost-effective option.
- The John Ruhrah building falls below the target EAS of 80 for district buildings used for instruction and does not meet the standard for supporting excellent teaching and learning.
- The school does not meet the acceptable utilization rate for City Schools' buildings (65-100 percent) at 190 percent.
- Projected enrollment indicates the need for expansion to serve the current and growing population; a larger facility is necessary to meet a target utilization rate of 90 percent.

C. PROPOSED EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS AND SERVICES

C.1 School Grade Organization:

John Ruhrah Elementary/Middle is a traditional elementary-middle school with grades Pre-K to 8. Consistent with the Prototype educational specifications, there is the desire to create appropriate separation between the elementary (grade PK - 5) and middle school (grade 6 - 8) students. This separation is most critical for the instructional spaces where the students spend the majority of their time, but it also applies to the various spaces and functions that are shared by all students. The instructional space separation is most easily addressed through physical separation of the classroom spaces assigned to each grade. The shared space separation is more a matter of location of shared functions and the ability to create paths to these shared spaces that minimize contact between the two segments of the school population.

C.2 Proposed Curriculum:

The John Ruhrah program contains several education programs which will impact the design of the building and space requirements. These programs are: ESOL, Judy Center, and the Newcomer Center.

C.4 Enrollment Projections:

Enrollment projections are based on historic trends using the grade progression ratio (GPR), which uses historical enrollment in conjunction with the number of students who progress on the following year. While these values are the basis for the design capacity at a school, a number of other factors are taken into consideration, including recent developments, population growths, and general community trends. In addition, the goal is to provide even sections through the school to allow all students to matriculate through. The design enrollment for Ruhrah has been determined to be 911.

C.5 Future Programs and Services:

Community Partners

The Newcomer Center, the Judy Center, Out of School Time Support, and Community Services Suite are all components of the Community Space. The Community Services Suite includes a pantry, personal care space with shower, and laundry space. The Newcomer Center will act as a vital community resource to serve the large immigrant population of the southeast.

Enrollment of English Learners is increasing throughout Baltimore City Schools and many of these students have limited formal schooling. The Southeast part of the city is heavily impacted by this increased enrollment with many families residing in the area. A Newcomer Center will provide specialized, targeted English language instruction for students new to the country with particular focus on meeting the unique needs of students with limited formal schooling in grades 3-8. Additionally, this center will allow for student intake and enrollment to occur in a single location streamlining the process for families.

The community spaces are to support the community outside the hours of the typical school day. Additional program and service options which may be located within the Community Space include an after school program for students, day care services, social services facilities, counseling facilities, offices, conference rooms, recreational spaces and multi-purpose use spaces.

Baltimore City Schools General Education Specification calls for 21st Century School Buildings to become hubs of the community. Creating schools as hubs includes incorporating programs and services for students, parents, and community members within the school building. It also includes providing an opportunity for them to determine which programs and services should be included in the 3000 square feet of community space.

To engage stakeholders in the program, service needs and design of the community space, City Schools worked with the Mayors Office and the Family League of Baltimore to incorporate the Community Schools Planning

process used at more than 40 City Schools.

The planning process includes the identification of a community base organization to work with each Year 1 and Year 2 school to form a school base core team to complete a community needs assessment, gap analysis, survey stakeholders, host community forums and use available data to determine program and service needs to be included in the community space.

INSPIRE

To leverage the 21st Century Schools Initiative and to enhance the connection between the schools and the surrounding neighborhoods, the Baltimore City Planning Department launched a new program called INSPIRE. INSPIRE stands for Investing in Neighborhoods and Schools to Promote Improvement, Revitalization, and Excellence. This planning program focuses on the neighborhoods immediately surrounding each of the new or renovated schools that are a part of the 21st Century program, specifically the a 1/4-mile surrounding each school. Once the Board of School Commissioners approves a feasibility study preferred school design option, the site-specific kickoff of the INSPIRE community engagement and planning process for the surrounding neighborhoods starts.

F. PROPOSED SITE REQUIREMENTS

F. PROPOSED SITE REQUIREMENTS

F. Proposed Site Requirements:

F.1 Parking - bus, car, delivery, service, staff, visitor:

There is currently no dedicated on-site parking; staff and visitors informally park out by the modulars, but here is no parking and pavement abuts the modulars and pathways to the main building, providing safety concerns to kids travling between structures. Most of the school parking is available on the street. Additional on-site parking for would be helpful; however, due to sight constraints and existing footprints, parking should not take precedence over play areas.

F.2 Service access:

Current service access is on the interior/north side of the L-shape of the building; conditions are such that turning around is difficult. The route to this area runs alongside the playarea in the front of the building, which is not ideal. A loading area for small truck deliveries should be provided. There should be a clear separation of the delivery access/routes from play areas.

F.3 Vehicle and pedestrian access:

The majority of the students walk to school, entering the building at the main entrance on Rapolla. Though there is a ramp, it is not known if it is ADA compliant. The main entrance along Rapolla should be maintained and made ADA compliant. Since students come from all directions, visual access and security in all directions should be considered.

F.4 Playing fields/courts/yards:

The only amenity currently on-site is a playground on the southwest corner, a field in the northwest forner of the site, and a painted asphalt surface on the north side of the building for hopscotch and similar games. There should be two separate play areas provided on site- one for younger kids (PK-2) and one for older (3-5). All green / play space should be secured with a loackable perimeter fence.

F.5 Natural environmental areas:

There are no natural areas, excluding the large setback of the building from Rapolla street, and a tree grove on the northwest corner of the site. The east and southeast sides of the site are concrete embankment; it is unknown why the slope was treated this way and should be given consideration. The grove should be maintained. Due to restricted space on the site, opportunities should be considered for providing outdoor learning via other building opportunities.

F.6 Utilities:

Current utilities for both fire and domestic water are shown on the City record documents to enter the building on the west side north of the main entrance. The plans show a 4" domestic service with a 4" meter and a 6" fire service with a 6" detector check. There are no specific site requirement deviations from those outlined in the general Educational Specifications Part 1/Section J.

F.7 Other:

Due to the age of the structure, there is no existing storm water management. The majority of the site is impervious surface forming a plateau to where the grade of the surrounding streets drops in the southeast corner. Stormwater management requirements will need to be addressed for all new construction. The stormwater management design techniques could be incorporated as an environmental literacy learning tool for the School. The concrete retaining walls along the south and east sides of the site will need to be considered if changes are made to or near them.







Existing Basement + 1st Floors


BUILDING 228 - BASEMENT & 1ST FLOOR PLANS N 0 10' 20' 30'
