City Schools Renaming Policy Requirements


The first procedural step in the naming or renaming of a school is to contact the Office of Achievement and Accountability. Once approval has been granted by the CEO, the School Leader, or CEO's designee, shall convene a school renaming committee Neighborhood community groups, organizations, students, teachers, the school principal, and other interested citizens participate in the process of name selection of the school program. This process can last several months and often involves other factors. The request and the process are shared in a public meeting Results are shared and the Board votes on the request in a public meeting.



- Legacy is something that one of your relatives has/had that they pass onto you and your family.
- Their legacy could be a business, house, or just something monumental that they took part in; a part of history. Something they're known for.
- Their name carries a special weight.
- Something your family and others hold to a high regard.



- School pride is being proud of your school. Proud of the community that's been built. Proud of what you're able to accomplish at your school.
- You can show school pride by being involved in school activities and working together with your fellow students and staff to make it the best place possible.






